Dear Families,

Parents do make a difference! Research shows that family engagement improves school readiness, student achievement, and social skills. Family engagement does not happen in a void. With two months remaining of school, we still have important work to do. Rather, it takes the committed actions of both families and schools working together through parent-teacher conferences as well as other forms of support to make a student successful. As teachers prepare for conferences, there is a growing body of evidence suggesting that family engagement matters for student success. Through this shared responsibility, schools reach out to and engage families in meaningful ways, and, similarly, families do their part to actively support their children's learning and development. Partnership with the school is a vital component to show your child that you value their education.

Many outside activities will be starting for students and it can become difficult to remain focused. It will be important to continue monitoring homework, attend school each day, be on time and be prepared. Your support and help is crucial.

## **California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) System**

Students in 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grade will be taking California's new statewide student assessment this month. The CAASPP tests are aligned with the new Common Core Standards, which are more challenging and rigorous than the old California Standards. The standards are more challenging because they require students to learn skills – such as academic writing, research and solving problems – in addition to memorizing content. Because the tests will measure skills, we expect that they will be more challenging for students. The window of testing will occur from Tuesday, April 21<sup>st</sup> through Thursday, May 8<sup>th</sup>. Please make sure your student is in school these days and ready to give their best effort. This is the time for them to show how much they have learned.

## **On Test Day**

- **Be sure your child gets a good night's sleep. Experts recommend that students at this age need eight to ten hours of sleep to function at their best.**
  - **Have your child eat a healthy breakfast to help them be more alert and can concentrate better.**
  - **Make sure your child is organized and prepared for their day so they only need to focus on doing well on the test.**
  - **Remain positive and show interest in the test.**
  - **Staying calm will help your child stay calm. If your student gets nervous about the test or is likely to experience anxiety during the test, help him/her practice some relaxation techniques.**
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## **Safety Awareness**

Please remember that all visitors and volunteers must enter through the front doors, sign-in at the office and receive a visitor's sticker before entering the campus. Parents must have contacted the teacher and made an appointment prior to your visit. Please do not proceed down either hallway to meet your child at the end of the day. Rather, wait until your child comes to you at the front or back gate. The safety of our students is our #1 priority.

I want to encourage Pony parents to attend PTA meetings that are held monthly. This organization helps support the goals of the school and provides parent/student/community nights and activities.
