I understand that doctor's appointments and emergencies do occur but, the number of early dismissals has become chronic and interrupts the learning environment at the school. Students with multiple early dismissals will be receiving a letter of concern. We must work together to ensure OUR children receive a great learning experience for the entire time they are in school.
