Open Enrollment

Open Enrollment is an opportunity for families that live within SCUSD boundaries to apply for spots in schools beyond their neighborhood school or to apply for enrollment in specialty programs and schools. Pony Express has kindergarten and 2nd grade openings. The dates for open enrollment are from February 16th starting at 8 a.m. – March 1st ending at 5 p.m. Once your child has been accepted into the school, you must register your child at the Enrollment Center to attend the new school of choice Monday, April 19th – Wednesday, April 28th, 2016.

Parents must indicate on the Open Enrollment application any Special Education Program Services their child is currently receiving. Students requiring special programs as a part of their Individual Educational Program (IEP) can participate in Open Enrollment based on space availability in both the required program and the school of choice. Students receiving Speech/Language Services, Resource Specialist Program (RSP) services and students who are fully included may apply for their school of choice through Open Enrollment. Parents interested in their child attending a specific special day class (SDC) program should contact their Program Specialist in the Special Education Department (916-643-9174).

Literacy

Literacy continues to be an area of focus at Pony Express. The core of the Kindergarten through sixth grade curriculum is Reading, Writing, Speaking, and Listening. At Pony, these skills are taught daily in a balanced and comprehensive program.

Our goal is to ensure that every student receives the support that he or she needs so that they are reading on grade level by the end of the school year. Therefore, it is vital that students are engaged in reading, writing, speaking, and listening activities every day. In the classroom, teachers have established specific routines that are followed daily to support reading.

Students have lots of opportunities to interact with fiction and non-fiction texts in a variety of ways so that they can continue to develop as critical readers. At Pony some of these activities include Shared Reading, Read Aloud, Interactive Read Aloud and Strategy Lessons. In order to ensure that your child is reading on grade level, we are asking that you partner with the school by using the following tips at home on a daily basis:

Sleep is critical to your child's academic success. Long-term memory is consolidated in the brain while
we sleep. Studies show that people who get 8 hours of sleep out-perform those who do not get
enough sleep by 3 to 1.

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- At the early grades, read to your child daily and allow them to read to you as well. If you speak a language other than English, then read to your child in that language. Take time to ask questions about their reading to determine their comprehension level.
- It is important that your child reads "just-right" books every day at home. Reading should not be frustrating. Children should be able to read the words on the page easily. They should read smoothly and they should be able to understand and talk about the book.
- Research shows that the more time a student reads the better his/her performance will be in school and on tests: 4-7 minutes = scores increase by 30%, 15 minutes = scores increase by 70%, 30 minutes = scores increase by 90%, 60 minutes = scores increase by 95%
